These days, it seems as if everyone is talking about NFTs. But what are they exactly? To begin with, NFT is short for "nonfungible token." If something is "nonfungible," this basically means that it is unique. If something is "fungible," on the other hand, then it is not unique, and

when one fungible item is exchanged for another, you end up with this same item. Money, such as U.S. dollars, is fungible, for example, as is Bitcoin.

An NFT can be anything digital, including digital art, video clips, photographs, music, or even a Tweet, stored on a blockchain, which is a kind of digital ledger. Most NFTs today are part of the Ethereum blockchain, where important information about each NFT is stored.

Some artists have embraced NFTs, since NFTs provide them with a way to sell their artworks online to global buyers and receive payment directly without having to go through an art gallery. And some collectors also appear to be equally enthusiastic about NFTs, with a few paying millions of dollars for certain ones.

Yet, there are some naysayers when it comes to NFTs. They point out that digital files can easily be copied and shared. They also say that NFTs are highly speculative items, which means that the prices can be very volatile and many may end up worthless. Government officials have stated that NFTs might be used for money laundering or other types of scams, such as Ponzi schemes. And a few people have raised questions about the environmental costs in producing NFTs, since blockchain transactions can consume large amounts of energy.

Although NFTs are still developing, some celebrities have flocked to them, buying Bored Ape Yacht Club NFTs for large sums of money and even creating their own NFTs.

Taiwan is known the world over for its spectacular scenery, friendly people, and amazing food. In fact, cuisine in Taiwan has become so renowned that Michelin, the French tire company that has been publishing respected food guides since 1900, has expanded its food guide empire.

Michelin Guide uses a series of stars for its ranking system, with three stars being the highest

and one star the lowest. If a restaurant receives a star in the ranking, this can be very beneficial for its business, while losing a star can often be very **detrimental** to a restaurant's future.

In 2022, Michelin announced the list for Taipei, Taichung, and for the first time, Kaohsiung and Tainan. This year in Taiwan, only one restaurant was deemed worthy of receiving the coveted Michelin three-star ranking. This top ranking was awarded to Le Palais, a Cantonese restaurant that has received three stars continuously for the past five years.

Seven restaurants in Taiwan received two Michelin stars, and thirty restaurants received one Michelin star. None of the restaurants in Tainan received the stars this year; however, there were many of them selected in the Bib Gourmand, which is the list of the restaurants that offer high-quality food at a bargain price. Besides, restaurants that were new to the one star list included Paris 1930 de Hideki Takayama and Shin Yeh Taiwanese Signature. So, if you like to go to a restaurant in Taiwan, consider picking up the latest Michelin guides and trying out some of the top rated places on the lists.
