Mayonnaise is made with eggs, oil, and an acid, usually vinegar or lemon juice. Besides making food taste great, it has another surprising use. It can be used to help animals that have swallowed lots of oil. In February 2021, there was an oil spill off the coast of Israel. Black oil washed up on many beaches. Parents of teenagers have a tricky job. How do they allow their teen to have the freedom to learn how to make good choices, but not too much freedom so that the teen gets into serious trouble? How do parents have an honest relationship with their children when it's normal for a teen to lie?

In fact, studies show that more than 90 percent of teens around the world lie to their parents about things like how they spend their money, what they're doing, and their whereabouts. Teens lie mostly to avoid getting into trouble, disappointing their parents, and not being able to do what they want in the future. Another reason why teens lie is that they are seeking independence. If their parents don't know everything that is going on, even if they have to lie about it, they are staying in control of this aspect of their lives.

While lying is generally considered to be not ideal, some experts consider it to be part of growing up. Teens who rebel slightly when growing up, such as telling occasional lies, tend to become more independent as adults than teens who always follow all the rules set for them. However, parents should still encourage honesty in their teens. If a teen lies at first but later tells the truth, the parent should say that they are disappointed about the lying but moreover appreciate the teen telling them the truth.

All parents want to have a healthy, honest relationship with their teens, and this is impossible when the parent is a tyrant. While lying is part of growing up and learning

how to make decisions, parents can also help teens realize that being honest is best for wholesome relationships.
