One obvious cause of the memory problems that some are now facing is the sense of isolation that has resulted from the lockdowns and shelter-in-place orders in a range of places. Scientific research has shown that the brain can be negatively affected because of lack of social contact, and this is especially true for those who already have memory issues or even Alzheimer's disease.

What's more, lack of social contact at work or at school, due to stay-at-home orders, has made many people rarely have a chance to share stories and memories with others. Of course, people are still sharing information online on social media sites, but this is not as beneficial as repeating stories in person, which can consolidate recollection and create "episodic memories."

Meanwhile, the Office for National Statistics in the United Kingdom has reported that rates of depression are now on the rise. Scientific studies have shown that depression can have an impact on the brain and on memory. In a similar way, general fatigue, which many people have complained about during the pandemic, can tax the brain and make remembering things even more difficult.

If you feel as if your memory is suffering because of the global pandemic, experts say that you can try walking outside, in an unfamiliar area if possible, since this can kick-start your brain's memory functions. Also, try to make sure that your weekdays and weekends are very different, so that the days don't start running together.

B. The Eiffel Tower in Paris is one of the most recognizable structures in the world. When this masterpiece of engineering was opened to the public during the World Fair in 1889, it claimed the title of tallest man-made structure on the planet at 324 meters in height. Since then, however, many taller buildings and towers have been built on every continent of the world, and some of them really have to be seen to be believed.

The title of tallest structure in the southern hemisphere goes to Auckland, New Zealand's Sky Tower. At 328 meters, it edges out neighboring Australia's tallest building, the Q1 Building in Gold Coast. The second tallest building south of the equator and the tallest in South America is the Gran Torre Santiago in the capital of Chile. In Africa, on the other hand, it is a tower in Johannesburg, South Africa called the Hillbrow Tower that claims top spot. At around 270m, it is about 30 meters shorter than the Gran Torre Santiago.

North of the equator is where the towers and buildings truly reach dizzying heights. For more than four decades, the Canadian National Tower in Toronto has been the tallest free-standing structure in North America at an incredible 553 meters. In Europe, it is the Ostankino Tower that tops the list. Located in the Russian capital of Moscow, it is almost a decade older than its Canadian counterpart, but stands 13 meters shorter. Asia, however, is home to the tallest of the tall. It has the five highest buildings in the world, including Dubai's Burj Khalifa, which stretches an astonishing 828 meters into the sky.

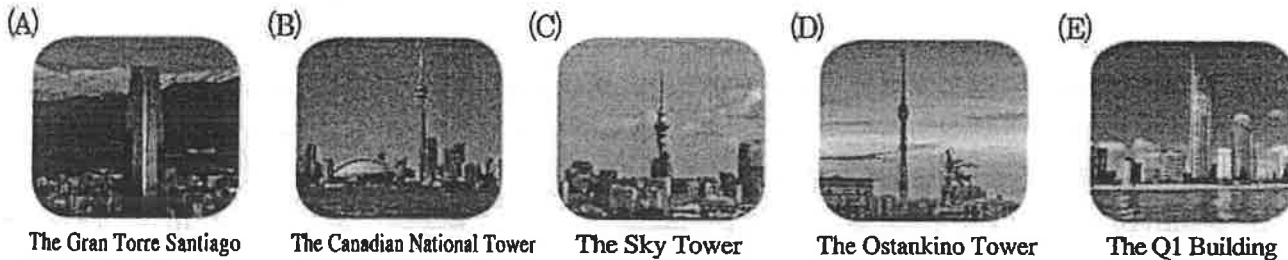

C. It is not uncommon for many social movements to go largely unnoticed for years or even decades. Then, something significant happens that raises awareness of the cause, and before you know it, almost everyone is talking about it. A great example of this phenomenon is the #MeToo movement. It took more than a decade from the time that this expression was first used to it becoming a globally-recognized symbol that spoke out against the sexual abuse and harassment of women.

The first use of the phrase "Me Too" can be traced back to a social media account in 2006. The person who coined the term and began using it was an activist and survivor of sexual assault named Tarana Burke. Her goal at the time had been to empower women who had been sexually harassed or assaulted in the workplace through the use of a phrase conveying the idea that they were not alone.

It was not until over a decade later, however, that the phrase made it into the national consciousness of the United States and then the rest of the world. And like so many things in modern society, it was the entertainment industry that turned the spotlight on it. One of Hollywood's worst-kept secrets had been the sexual harassment of female actors by male movie directors, producers, and studio executives. While this had been going on since the birth of the film in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century, most people in this industry seldom spoke about

it. The terrible behavior of one filmmaker over many years, however, changed all of that.

In the late 2017, many allegations of abuse and harassment were made against filmproducer Harvey Weinstein. While the investigation of his crime was being conducted, a famous actress made a Tweet mentioning "Me Too." Almost overnight, hashtag #MeToo went viral online, and as the saying goes, the rest is history.

Nikola Tesla and Thomas Edison were two inventors who made significant contributions to the fields of electricity and technology. While they both left a permanent mark on history, their approaches and inventions differed in many ways. Tesla envisioned a world where electricity could be transmitted efficiently over long distances, thus transforming the way we power our cities. His work on alternating current (AC), including his invention of the AC motor, helped achieve this vision by forming the foundation of the modern-day electrical grid. Another of Tesla's groundbreaking inventions was the Tesla coil, which enabled the wireless transmission of energy. Although the device was never actually used to produce power, it paved the way for advancements in communication technologies, influencing the development of radio, television, and even the wireless charging systems we use today. Despite his brilliant inventions, Tesla never achieved commercial success. His ideas were often considered too advanced for their time, and he struggled to gain funding for his projects. As a result, he lived a life of financial hardship and died with little wealth. Fortunately, Tesla left behind an extraordinary legacy and is now recognized as one of the world's greatest inventors.

A contemporary of Tesla, Edison was also interested in electricity and electrical systems. But while Tesla's genius was often directed toward futuristic ideas, Edison was a practical thinker whose focus was refining existing technologies to make them more efficient or commercially viable. Undoubtedly, Edison's greatest achievement was the creation of a long-lasting light bulb. He didn't actually invent the light bulb-plenty of others had developed and patented their own versions before Edison created the first truly practical one. But Edison's light bulb so revolutionized the way we live and work. Indeed, it has brought light to the darkest corners of the world and improved life for billions. Another of Edison's accomplishments was the creation of the phonograph, a machine that could record and play back sound. Developed while Edison was working on improving the telephone, the phonograph transformed how we capture and listen to music, speech, and other audio recordings, and it helped bring about the modern recording industry. Though Edison met with great commercial success during his lifetime, his aggressive methods of achieving that success are not always viewed kindly. Still, Edison's contributions have marked him as one of the most influential and successful inventors in history.
